H. E. Barney Burroughs is owner and CEO of Building Wellness Consultancy, Inc. (BWCI), a consulting firm serving the HVAC industry with focus on the indoor environment of buildings; performance monitoring and diagnostics; and the application of enhanced gas phase and particulate filtration systems. During his 40 years in the HVAC industry, Mr. Burroughs has been involved with research and development, manufacturing, marketing, application, and distribution of specialty filtration and air cleaning products. He was founder and owner of Purafil, Inc. for 20 years prior to assuming the leadership of ASHRAE as the elected President in 1987/88, after which he founded BWCI. He was a principal and remains an outside director in EDI Engineers, LTD., Atlanta-based consultants on IT, security, and audio/visual communications.

Mr. Burroughs is a prolific author and lecturer on indoor air quality, filtration, and moisture management. He is a frequent presenter at technical Society meetings and is the primary revision author of the textbook, *Managing Indoor Air Quality*, now in its fourth edition. In addition to the many committee positions leading to and subsequent to his ASHRAE presidency, Mr. Burroughs has remained active in the affairs of the industry and Society. He was Chairman and is a current member of the Standard Project Committee that developed ASHRAE Standard 52.2; served on the Presidential Ad Hoc Committee on Building Security and Bio-terrorism Response; Member on SSPC that developed Standard 62.2, the Residential Ventilation Standard; chaired the Environmental Health Committee; and is voting member of TC 2.3 and TC 2.4. He was a presenter on the first ASHRAE Satellite broadcast/webcast, "Homeland Security for Buildings."

In addition to being a Presidential Member, Mr. Burroughs is a Fellow with ASHRAE, has experience as a Distinguished Lecturer; has received the DSA and was recently honored with the Exceptional Service Award. He is the 2009 recipient of the Environmental Health Award. He graduated from DePauw University and received the 50 year Alumni Outstanding Community Service Award from that institution.
