*WHEREAS, New Mexico engineers play a critical role in addressing technological challenges from designing energy-efficient building systems suited to our climate to rebuilding towns impacted by natural disasters and supporting infrastructure across our diverse landscapes; and*

*WHEREAS, engineering is often called the "invisible" or "stealth" profession because nearly everything we use and rely on has been engineered, yet the individuals behind these innovations often remain unseen even as their work shapes life in New Mexico every day; and*

*WHEREAS, National Engineers Week (EWeek), established in 1951, is dedicated to fostering a diverse and well-educated future engineering workforce by increasing awareness of and interest in engineering and technology careers, including opportunities right here in New Mexico; and*

*WHEREAS, EWeek is a coalition of more than 70 engineering, education, and cultural societies, along with over 50 corporations and government agencies, committed to raising public awareness of engineers' positive contributions to quality-of-life contributions that are vital to New Mexico's economic growth, sustainability, and innovation; and*

*WHEREAS, EWeek promotes recognition among parents, teachers, and students of the importance of technical education and strong skills in math, science, and technology, inspiring young people across New Mexico to pursue engineering careers and ensuring a vibrant, diverse workforce for our state's future; and*
