1. Call to Order

Mr. Raul Simonetti called the meeting to order at 8:03 a.m.

2. Approval of January 20, 2024 Minutes

Ms. Suzanne LeViseur moved and Mr. Brian Fronk seconded to approve the minutes from the January 20, 2024 meeting. VOTE: 17-0-0, CNV. Passed

3. BOD ExO Comments

Mr. Cheng Wee Leong presented the ASHRAE Leadership Presentation, a wide-ranging and in-depth view of the Society's activities since January 2024. He emphasized the 'Society Snapshot,' the work on the Strategic Plan, which will be announced at the 2025 Winter Conference, the new Center for Excellence in Building Decarbonization (CEBD), the new ASHRAE Region XV, membership, publications and the 2024-2025 Society theme, 'Empowering Our Workforce: Building a Sustainable Future.'

4. Host Committee Reports

2025 Winter, Orlando. Jason Aphonso emphasized the experience of the host committee as well as its succession plan to be ready for the 2025 Winter Conference and for future conferences in Orlando. He said the Welcome Party is planned for the Orlando Auto Museum at Dezerland and Members Night Out will feature the Bay Kings Band. Tours are being planned for the Kennedy Space Center, Epic Universal District Energy plant, Florida Solar Energy, OUC Gardenia Innovation plant and the Orange County Convention Center.

2025 Annual, Phoenix. John Kuderer, co-chair of the host committee said they have lined up 20 volunteers and are observing at the 2024 Annual Conference to better prepare hosting the 2025 Annual Conference.

5. 2024 Annual Conference, Indianapolis

Mr. Brian Fronk reported that the conference successfully completed the more-aggressive paper review schedule for the benefit of authors. There are 60 papers accepted for the conference, and all but 40 presentations have been uploaded for a commercialism review. The student papers were reviewed for awards, and there was one overall winner and two honorable mentions. All authors were given oral presentations.

6. 2025 Winter Conference, Orlando

Mr. Som Shrestha reported that 297 conference paper abstracts were received, the most for a winter conference, and most have been reviewed. Program proposals are due August 2, 2024 and papers are due September 4th. First reviews on papers are due September 27th. Authors will be given the option to pick oral or poster presentations.

7. 2025 Annual Conference, Phoenix

Mr. Craig Bradshaw reported that the tracks have been selected, been reviewed by the Technical Activities Committee and track chairs will be assigned shortly.

8. Subcommittee Reports

a. CEC Executive Subcommittee

Mr. Simonetti said that the 2024 Annual Conference had 9 sponsors, which raised \$86K with \$71K net to the Society, a record amount for an annual conference. Also, for the first time, CEC is putting two conferences on at the same time and in the same location. The 2024 Annual Conference is being co-located with the Conference on Integrated Design, Construction and Operations (CIDCO). The CIDCO conference will take place in two of the technical program rooms on Monday, June 24 to Wednesday, June 26.

b. Topical Conferences Subcommittee

Mr. Davide Ziviani updated the committee on the conferences in process and proposed conferences.

Topical Conferences in Process

- i. September 26-27, 2024, Women in ASHRAE Leadership Symposium, Chicago, IL. The program is set.
- ii. October 3-4, 2024 – 6th Conference on Efficient Building Design, American University of Beirut, Beirut, Lebanon. There were fewer papers submitted for this conference and because of the conflict in the Middle East, this conference will be presented in hybrid – in-person and online live streaming.
- iii. October 21-23, 2024 – 2024 ASHRAE Decarbonization Conference: Decarbonizing Existing Tall Buildings, New York City. The technical program will be posted in July 2024. Also, on the day before the conference starts, Sunday, October 20, a Workforce Development Summit will held.
- iv. April 23-24, 2025, Third International Conference on Energy and Indoor Environment for Hot Climates, Doha, Qatar. A call for papers is currently open.
- v. June 2025 – Industrial Ventilation Conference co-located with the 2025 Annual Conference (tracks only), Phoenix, AZ. This track has been incorporated into the 2025 Annual Conference. However, there will not be a separate conference – no separate registration, signage or events.
- vi. September 24-26, 2025 – IEQ 2025, Montreal, QC, Canada. A call for papers is currently open.
- vii. December 8-11, 2025 -- Buildings XVI, Clearwater, FL. A call for papers will be announced in July 2024.

Topical Conferences Proposed

- i. October 2025, 2025 ASHRAE Decarbonization Conference, Chicago, Illinois

In addition, the following conferences were put on since the 2024 Winter Conference:

- i. April 17-19, 2024 -- ASHRAE International Conference on Building Decarbonization, Madrid. The conference was organized in conjunction with the Spain Chapter. There were 220 attendees from 28

countries and included 103 speakers. 43 papers were presented. There were 17 sponsors and \$165K, a record sponsorship level for conferences.

c. Joint Exposition Policy Committee

Mr. Michael Cooper prepared a report and it was presented by Ms. Maggie Moninski. She said the 2025 AHR Expo has nearly 500K of exhibit space sold and is expected to exceed the 2020 Expo held in Orlando. There is not an AHR Expo Mexico show in 2024 – the next one will take place in September 2025 in Monterrey and has already exceeded all previous show bookings in Mexico. Negotiations are continuing with Las Vegas, which has loosened its demand for a show every other year and has agreed to every three years. Chicago, Orlando and Las Vegas will comprise the three-city rotation for hosting the AHR Expo.

d. Operations Subcommittee

Ms. Moninski reported on activities of the subcommittee. One of the items is to bring forth editorial changes that need to be made to the CEC Manual of Procedures. She moved that the following two changes to the MOP be approved (strikethrough indicates deletion; double underscore indicates additions):

SECTION 3 – CONFERENCES AND EXPOSITIONS COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

3.1 The Conferences and Expositions Committee shall provide ASHRAE members and other meeting attendees with fully coordinated, cost effective meeting experiences with balanced technical and business/professional content. The committee shall prepare technical ~~presentations~~ conferences and expositions that expand on ASHRAE’s position as leader in the HVAC&R industry, provide technology transfer of new innovations in the HVAC&R industry.

SECTION 5 – CEC CHAIR

The CEC chair is responsible for overall operations of the committee, serves as a voting member of Members Council, and serves as a non-voting member of the Joint Exposition Policy Committee.

Vote: 16-0-0, CNV. Passed

Also, she said work needed to be continued on updating training materials, including creating training videos for session chairs.

e. Paper Submission ad hoc Subcommittee

Ms. Kristen Cetin gave the latest update on the ad hoc’s activities since it was started in October 2023. She said the condensed, tight schedule created for the 2024 Winter Conference was tweaked for the 2024 Annual Conference and has been applied to the 2025 Winter Conference. She said a Research Summit had been organized for the 2024 Annual Conference but noted that there are more researchers at the winter conference and suggested that a Research Summit be organized only for winter conferences. Papers are still being reviewed from the 2023 Winter Conference that were invited to submit a paper for ASHRAE’s journal, Science and Technology for the Built Environment. Staff is implementing DOI (Direct Object Indicator) for accepted papers at winter, annual and topical conferences from 2023 forward. Also, staff will make a priority getting the papers accepted for winter and annual conferences posted online sooner. The ad hoc will next consider eliminating the questions and answers option for approved technical papers. Lastly, to give greater recognition to people who review papers, a new Reviewer ribbon was made available at the 2024 Annual Conference for the first time.

9. MBOs

Mr. Simonetti reviewed the committee’s MBOs for 2023-2024. See Attachment A.
Ms. Moninski reviewed the committee’s MBO’s for 2024-2025. See Attachment B.

10. New Business

Mr. Aaron Boranian brought up the idea of getting engagement in new programs, such as a Lightning Round or a Networking session. Ms. Moninski said she would start a discussion with CEC ExCom.


