5. Foster collaboration with other international societies to improve our historical research and support history-related activities of the Society.

Mr. Borges reported to the committee his efforts to collaborate with similar groups such as CIBSE, AiCARR, CEN, IIAR, AAR and GCCA.

Mr. Borges looked into the Engineering & Technology History Wiki, a consortium of engineering societies, <u>(ethw.org)</u> and found there would be a cost of \$3000 per year to participate. The Historical Committee does not currently have the budget for this therefore MBO #5 will be considered complete for 2020-2021 but Mr. Borges and Mr. Nagengast suggest that the committee consider pursuing this in the future.

6. Encourage younger members of ASHRAE to have interest in history-related activities of the Society.

Mr. Borges reported this MBO complete will the PAOE suggestions from the committee as shown in Attachment B.

7. Leadership Recall - arrange for videos at Annual Meeting 2021.

This MBO remains on-going. Due to Covid-19 the last three ASHRAE Conferences being virtual no interviews were conducted. The committee will continue efforts to schedule interviews when in-person meetings can resume. Mr. Nagengast reminded in-coming chair, Mr. Morasch, that transcripts of the interviews should be obtained and posted with the interview videos.

8. Historical Subcommittees

8.1 Administrative/Archives

There is no current guideline and material archived was done so with no set policy. A lack of a retention policy has resulted in the unfortunate loss of some valuable material. However significant historical material has been acquired, much of it funded by the Historical Committee. A comprehensive policy is still needed to ensure future material is not lost. Consideration of the following should be included in a policy:

Selection: Determination of importance.

• Storage: Factors such as temperature, humidity, and container material.

• Digitization: Which material, space needs/size reduction, format, periodic review with

technological changes.

• Retention: Length of time and review.

8.2 Communications/Historians Guidelines

Mr. Morasch stated, as in-coming chair, that the committee should develop and maintain and on-going quarterly newsletter for regional and chapter historians. The first newsletter release date is targeted for end of July 2021.

An action item was assigned to staff to locate a list the RMCRs and send to the committee. (ACTION ITEM 4)

Re: Action Item 3 - Develop parameters and guidelines for content inclusion in ASHRAE's archive.

Some thoughts for discussion.

Currently ASHRAE has no guideline for selecting, acquiring, cataloging or storing Society or Industry historical material. The approach has been hit or miss. In the recent past, when historical material became available the decision on inclusion was made by the ASHRAE Librarian, Director of Publishing and Communications, members of the Historical Committee, or consensus among these three entities.

Unfortunately this has in some instances resulted in important material being missed, or even discarded (The Muffley Patent File comes to mind), so it is evident that ASHRAE needs a policy.

Despite the policy shortcoming, much significant historical material has been acquired by ASHRAE. Many ASHRAE publications have been archived. Two significant collections were added from the estate of Gershon Meckler and the Engineering Societies Library, as well as material from the Franklin Institute. For a number of years the Historical Committee funded purchases of material. ASHRAE now has one of the premier collections of HVAC&R historical material. Thus the past successful efforts should be continued under an organized policy.

Discussion of such a policy might include the areas of selection, storage, what should be digitized and format, and retention.

Selection – We can't save everything but how do we determine the importance.

Storage – historical material must be stored properly, taking into account factors such as temperature, humidity, container material.

Digitization – What material can or should be converted to electronic format to reduce the storage space needs. What should the format be? And there should be a provision to periodically review the stored formats as related to changing technology to assure that formats are changed before becoming obsolescent.

Retention – How long should historical material be retained? Most organizations recognize that recent history is necessary for operation but historical material may become less necessary and/or useful over time. Often some of that material is no longer necessary to keep.

Good evening all,

I'd like to present my report for our meeting, but first I'd like to apologize for my absence. I was booked to teach a class this week, unbeknownst to me until Friday. Hopefully my absence does not affect our quorum.

My report is as follows:

- Comments on Bern's report for Action Item 3, I completely agree with the guidance that is required, especially with regards to what kind of containers should be used. I'm providing storage space for Toronto Chapter's archives this year in my storage container. Unfortunately it's unconditioned, and so we're looking at desiccant options to protect the documents in Rubbermaid containers.
- Action Item 4 I haven't managed to develop an outline for the templates and procedures for documents storage yet. I will continue to work on this.
- Action Item 6 As Bern mentioned last meeting finding people of historical significance while also would fall under Diversity in ASHRAE is challenging. While there are no shortage of Women, BIPOC, and LGBTQ+ members who have contributed greatly to science and engineering in the past, finding ones with an immediate connection to our industry and specifically our society is certainly a struggle. So my suggestion is two fold:
 - As part of our mandate to document history of ASHRAE as it happens, I suggest we propose a PAOE Presidential Initiative to award points for identifying and documenting:
 - a. persons who fall under Diversity in ASHRAE from the chapter who have won an ASHRAE Technical Award.
 - At the Toronto Chapter we have a semi-regular vignette called "On the Shoulders of Giants" where we showcase people in the past who do have not necessarily directly impacted the HVAC&R industry, however whom without our industry would not be possible. Previous subjects were Maxwell Father of the governor and control theory, Vitruvius, author of De architectura describing the construction and operation of hypocausts, etc. This year we are focusing on Diversity in ASRHAE members with similar lose connections. Currently we're researching Marie Curie for the upcoming year as well. Her research into radioactive elements was critical in the understanding of radiation and of course led to nuclear power generation. While these are loose connections, they no doubt impact our industry greatly, and align with our goals of sustainability. As finding persons who fall under Diversity in ASRHAE who were of historical interest in a direct connection to our industry is quite a large task, I would suggest we also recognize those who have had a strong influence on our industry. I would suggest we propose another PAOE Presidential Initiative:

- For identifying and documenting persons who fall under Diversity in ASRHAE of historical interest within the chapter's territory who have greatly influenced the HVAC&R industry.
- b. For identifying and documenting persons who would fall under Diversity in ASHRAE of historical interest within the chapter's country. (worth more points than a))
- c. For identifying and documenting persons who would fall under Diversity in ASHRAE of historical interest within the chapter's territory (worth more points than b)),

I haven't included points as I'm not sure what would be appropriate. I understand that the PAOE suggestions are typically recommended at the Winter Conference as per Dean's previous email, however I did note item 2 of the 2020-2021 MBO said that to get ahead of the PAOE committee cycle with a proposal for the following year's PAOE Letter in Summer 2021.

• For new business I'd like to suggest that whenever a Gold Ribbon Award is awarded, the winning article be shared via the History RVC's to each chapter Historian, to inspire Historians as well as recognize the work of the winning author.
