INTERPRETATION IC 90.1-2013-20 OF ANSI/ASHRAE/IES STANDARD 90.1-2013 Energy Standard for Buildings Except Low-Rise Residential Buildings

<u>Request from</u>: Jason Ostapchuk, City of Ottawa Building Code Services, 255 Centrum Blvd., Ottawa, Ontario K1E 2K5.

Reference: This request for interpretation refers to the requirements presented in ANSI/ASHRAE/IES Standard 90.1-2013, Section 5.4.3.4 Exception 6, regarding entrance vestibules.

Background: A 1 story commercial strip mall with multiple suites (units) each with their own entrance door to the exterior. The Exception #6 listed in 5.4.3.4 to omit a vestibule from each entrance seems to imply 1000 ft2 for the entire building. We want to know if the 1000 ft2 exemption is related to the building area or the area of each suite.

<u>Interpretation</u>: The 1000 ft2 exemption listed in Exemption # 6 in Section 5.4.3.4 can be applied to a suite that is less than 1000 ft2 in a building more than 1000 ft2.

Question: Is this interpretation correct?

<u>Answer:</u> No, Exception #6 is for buildings less than 1000 ft2 (100m2) located in climate zones 4 thru 8.

<u>Comments</u>: However, Exception #7 can be applied to an exterior door (entrance door as opposed to a rear exit or loading dock door) to a 3000 ft2 (300m2) suite in a building with a gross floor area greater than 3000 ft2 (300m2). Also, see the definition of building entrance, which in the case of the tenant suite you describe would be the "entrance" to each space.
